

General Election to Lok-Sabha, 2019

Scheme for Kashmiri migrants to vote in person at transitory camps and voting by means of postal ballot.

Introductory

- 1.1 A large number of electors registered in several parts of the State of Jammu and Kashmir, particularly Kashmir province, were forced to leave their native places during late 1980s and early 1990s because of the terrorist activities of extremist elements supported from across the Indian borders. They are still residing either in transitory camps in Jammu and Delhi or elsewhere in several other parts of the State or outside the State. Because of their emotional ties with their native place and in order not to lose their permanent residentship status of their native State, they were not willing to enroll in the constituencies in which they are physically resident presently but wanted their names to be continued in the rolls of their native places. Therefore, the Election Commission, after consultation with the Central Government and the State Government, decided that such of the migrants who left their native places in Kashmir Valley after 1st April, 1989 shall be deemed to be ordinarily resident in the constituencies in which they were so resident before their migration and their names shall continue to be borne on the electoral rolls of the assembly and parliamentary constituencies concerned in the Kashmir Province of the State of Jammu and Kashmir. Their descendants, who have meanwhile come of age, were also permitted to have their names included in those rolls on the basis of their claim applications.
- 1.2 At the time of the election to the State Legislative Assembly in 1996, a special scheme was devised, which enabled these migrant voters to vote by postal ballot in their respective constituencies of their native places. For this purpose, the Jammu and Kashmir Representation of the People Act, 1957 and the Jammu and Kashmir Conduct of Elections Rules, 1965 were specifically amended. According to that scheme, the said voters, who were called as 'notified voters' under section 70(c) of the J&K 1957 Act, were required to make an application in Form 12 C appended to the J&K 1965 Rules to a specific Assistant Returning Officer, designated by the Election Commission at Jammu, for supply of postal ballot papers, if they wished to vote by post. Such applications were

required to reach the said Assistant Returning Officer at least 10 days before the date of poll in the respective constituencies. Further, these applications were required to be verified and attested by the officers in charge of the transitory camps or by any other gazetted officer. Such of those migrant voters as are employed in the government jobs or were retired pensioners were required to have their applications verified and attested by the head of their offices or by the manager of the bank or treasury from where they were drawing their pension. The ARO, on being satisfied as to the entitlement of the applicant to vote by post, was then obliged to send the postal ballot paper to the applicant at least 8 days before the date of poll. The marked postal ballot papers were to reach the Returning Officer of the constituency concerned before the hours fixed for counting of votes.

- 1.3 Similar facility to the aforesaid class of voters was extended at the time of the general election to the House of the People held in 1988 and 1999 by amending the Representation of the People Act, 1951 [Section 60(c)] and the Conduct of Elections Rules, 1961 (Rules 27A to 27K).
- 1.4 Taking into consideration several complaints that the postal ballot papers sent to and by the aforesaid notified class of voters from different parts of the Country were delayed in transmission, the Election Commission had decided during the general election to the Legislative Assembly of Jammu and Kashmir held in September-October, 2002 that in order to make the voting right of such migrant voters effective and really meaningful, they should be enabled **to vote in person at the transitory camps** where they were living in Jammu, Delhi etc., by providing polling station(s) specially for them (hereinafter referred to as 'special polling stations') in those transitory camps. Further, such of the migrant voters as were living not in camps but nearby in Jammu and Delhi or in some neighboring places and wished to vote in person at these polling stations were **also permitted to avail of that facility**. Those of migrant voters who **were not in a position to avail of this facility to vote in person** at these special polling stations were given the option of exercising their right to vote by availing of the facility to **vote by post** as in the previous elections.
- 1.5 The scheme devised for the purpose worked very well during the general election to the Legislative Assembly held in September-October, 2002. Similar arrangements were

during General Elections to Lok-Sabha held in 2004, 2009 & 2014. Though section 25 of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, does not expressly provide setting up of polling stations outside the territorial jurisdiction of the constituency, whereas, section 36-A of the Jammu & Kashmir Representation of People Act, 1957 makes provision of setting up of polling stations outside territorial jurisdiction of the constituency.

- 1.6 The Commission has, after taking into consideration the success of this scheme, decided to extend the said scheme for the general election to the House of the People from Jammu and Kashmir scheduled to be held in April-May, 2019.

Details of Scheme

- 2.1 Section 25 of the Representation of the People Act, 1951 provides that the District Election Officer shall, with the previous approval of the Election Commission, provide a sufficient number of polling stations for every constituency and the polling area or group of voters for which they have respectively been provided.
- 2.2 In view of the position stated in the preceding para, the Election Commission has, as a first step, to specify, in terms of Section 25 of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, the Kashmiri migrants whose names are registered in any of the three Parliamentary Constituencies in Kashmir province, as a group of voters [hereinafter referred to as 'specified' voters] for whom the polling stations may be provided outside the territorial limits of those constituencies, i.e., special polling stations at Delhi, Jammu and Udhampur.
- 2.3 Simultaneously, those of the, Kashmiri migrants who are living far away from the camps, etc., and wish to vote by post, have been separately notified as 'notified voters' in terms of Section 60(c) of the said Act read with rule 27A(b) of the Conduct of Elections Rules, 1961. Necessary consultation with the Central Government has been made in this regard as required under the said Section 60(c).

Appointment of Assistant Returning Officers for 'specified' and 'notified' voters

- 3.1 To operationalise this scheme, Assistant Commissioner, Revenue in the Office of Relief and Rehabilitation Commissioner, Jammu who has several officers of the rank of Superintendent. Etc., to assist him, may be designated as Assistant Returning Officer for the three Parliamentary Constituencies in the Kashmir Valley. He may be made responsible for the receipt of applications from the electors who wish to vote at the special polling stations and also from those who wish to vote by post. He may also be made responsible for preparation of marked copies of electoral rolls for those polling stations, etc., and all other arrangements for the conduct of polls at these polling stations.
- 3.2 Likewise, Deputy Director, Horticulture, Planning & Marketing, Delhi may also be appointed as the ARO for the receipt of applications, conduct of poll, etc., at the special polling station(s) to be provided in Delhi.
- 3.3 Collector, Northern Railways, Udhampur may also be appointed as ARO in respect of the special polling station(s) at Udhampur.
- 3.4 Further, these AROs may be made responsible not only for the conduct of poll at the special polling stations but also for the counting of votes cast at these polling stations, which would obviate the necessity of transporting the EVMs used at these polling stations to the Returning Officers of the three parliamentary constituencies across the Kashmir Valley. The result of the polling at these polling

stations can be ascertained by the said AROs and communicated to the ROs concerned which would be taken into account by the RO for determining and declaring the final result of the election in their constituencies.

- 3.5 Keeping in view the convenience of voters, living in various camps in Jammu Division and Delhi, camps and also nearby, Commission has approved the following special polling stations in Jammu, Udhampur and Delhi :-

- 4.1 In so far as the Kashmiri Migrants living in other parts of the country are concerned, it may not be feasible to provide polling stations for them and they will have the option to exercise their franchise through the postal ballot system, as was done at the time of general elections in 1996, 1998 and 1999, 2002, 2008 and 2009 and 2014 and the arrangements made in this behalf, will have to be repeated.

Collection of information from 'specified voters' as to where they would like to vote.

- 4.2 In order to ascertain as to who among the specified voters would like to vote at which of the above-mentioned polling stations, the ARO may ask the voters to give their preference in writing. As this information is to be gathered for the purpose of allocating these voters to the above mentioned polling stations, it may suffice if the head of the family or any senior member of the family gives intimation in respect of all the members of his family and we may not insist upon individual intimation from each elector. Though the right to vote is an individual right, the gathering of such information from the head of the family would not militate against the individual right as at the time of election, the voter concerned will have to exercise that right individually after satisfying the polling staff of his identity. This information may be obtained from the head/senior members of the families in a non-statutory form, called 'Form M' (copy enclosed).
- 4.3 Copies of this form may be distributed through the Relief Commissioner's office at Jammu and Resident Commissioner's office at Delhi and through the camp commandants of the migrant camps. Wide publicity may also be given in the newspapers and also through the head of departments in the case of registered migrants who are working in the Government offices in and around Jammu.
- 4.4 The head/senior members of the families of specified voters may be asked to give the requisite information in Form M to the above-referred AROs at Jammu, Udhampur and Delhi immediately and atleast 10 days before the date of poll.
- 4.5 To enable the applicants to give the requisite intimation in Form M by the stipulated date, copies of the electoral rolls of all three Parliamentary Constituencies may be made available urgently at the offices of the above AROs for inspection by the intending applicants.

Assignment of specified voters to special polling stations and preparation of marked copies of electoral rolls.

- 5.1. On the basis of the intimations given by the specified voters in Form M, the AROs may Cull out lists, Constituency wise, (showing therein assembly segment) of electors who opt for voting in person at the above mentioned polling station and then these electors may be assigned to the different polling stations as per the preference indicated by them. If at any polling station, the number of electors from any particular Constituency is exceedingly large, say more than 1,200, more than one booth may be provided for them in the same polling station location for the convenience of voters. The list of these special polling stations with the groups of specified voters assigned to each polling station may then be notified, constituency wise, by the District Election Officers concerned under Section 25 of the Representation of People Act, 1951.
- 5.2. The provision of the above mentioned special polling stations in the transitory camps, etc., would mean that the specified class of voters would be entitled to vote only at the specially provided polling stations and not in the polling stations normally provided for them in their native places in their respective constituencies. It will have to be ensured that when these persons vote in the special polling stations, nobody else votes for them in their normal polling stations in the constituency. The Returning Officers will have to so prepare the marked copies of the electoral roll to be used at the normal polling stations that they contain a clear indication as to which of the voters would vote at the special polling stations and would not be entitled to vote at the normal polling stations. Such indication may be given by putting the letters 'VSPS' [to denote 'voting at special polling station'] against the names of the voters who give intimation of their intention to vote at the special polling stations. [These marked copies will also contain the letters 'PB' against the names of those electors who wish to vote by post and have been supplied with the postal ballot papers].
- 5.3. The marked copies of the electoral rolls to be used at the special polling stations will consist of only the names of those electors who have been assigned to those polling stations as mentioned in paras 4.1 and 4.2 above. Instead of giving the whole electoral roll of the constituency running into several hundred pages and marking the names of persons who will be entitled to vote at these special polling stations, separate marked copy of the electoral roll may be prepared, polling station wise, containing the names 'of only those electors who have been assigned to only those polling stations as per paras 4.1 and 4.2 above. This marked copy of the electoral roll for the special polling stations may be prepared in the format at Annexure-I hereto. On the basis of the marked copy of the electoral roll for each special polling station so prepared, the Returning Officer of the constituency will mark the letters 'VSPS' against the names of the persons, included in the said marked copy (Annexure-I), in the marked copies of the

electoral roll to be used at the respective polling stations normally provided for these voters in their native places, as envisaged in para 4.2 above.

Conduct of poll

- 6.1 The conduct of poll at these special polling stations will be conducted by using separate EVMs for each PC as at the other normal polling stations in the constituency and all rules and directions and instructions applicable to the conduct of poll at the normal polling stations will apply at these special polling stations also.

Postal ballot papers for notified electors

- 7.1 Any 'notified' voter who wishes to vote by post is required to make an application for postal ballot in Form 12C appended to the Conduct of Elections Rules, 1961 to any of the above AROs at least 10 days before the date of poll in the constituency in-which he is registered as elector.
- 7.2 The Returning Officers of the said 3 Parliamentary Constituencies have to make available well in advance, the electoral rolls of the parliamentary constituencies concerned in the offices of the above AROs to enable the 'notified' voters to fill in their required particulars in their applications in Form- 12C.
- 7.3 These applications before submission are required to be verified and attested by the officers in charge of transitory camps or by any other gazetted officer. Sufficient number of gazetted officers should, therefore, be made available for the purpose in the offices of the aforementioned AROs.
- 7.4 The ARO at Jammu, "Assistant Commissioner, Revenue" in the Office of Relief and Rehabilitation Commissioner, Jammu will be solely responsible for handling the applications in Form-12C received from 'notified' voters and for supply of postal ballot papers to them. For this purpose, all Returning Officers of three Parliamentary Constituencies shall make available to the ARO at Jammu sufficient number of ballot papers to be used as postal ballots.
- 7.5 Deputy Director, Horticulture, Planning & Marketing, New Delhi and Collector, Northern Railways, Udampur, shall make every endeavor to forward with least delay all applications in (Form-12C) received by them for postal ballot paper to the designated ARO at Jammu. They will also maintain a complete list of applications so received by them and forwarded to the ARO at Jammu.
- 7.6 The designated ARO at Jammu, on being satisfied as to the entitlement of the applicant to vote by post, shall then be obliged to send the postal ballot paper to the applicant at least 8 days before the date of poll. The postal ballots and accompanying documents (Form 13-A, 13-B, 13-C and 13-D) shall be sent by the ARO at Jammu to 'notified' voters by registered post.
- 7.7 Duly filled in Postal Ballot Papers should be sent by such voters through Registered Post (pre-paid by RO) to the Returning Officer of the Parliamentary Constituency concerned so as to reach him before the hour fixed for counting of

votes. This will be the responsibility of the Postal Authorities. The Commission will issue a separate instruction to Postal Authorities.

- 7.8 The 'notified' voters can also post their applications (Form-12C) for supply of postal ballots and, later on their marked postal ballot papers in the special letter boxes, which will be available at the offices of the abovementioned Assistant Returning Officers at Jammu, Delhi and Udhampur.
- 7.9 The AROs at Delhi and Udhampur shall send the applications in Form-12C received by them to the ARO at Jammu for issue of postal ballots to the voters. Similarly, all three AROs at Jammu, Delhi and Udhampur shall send the marked postal ballots received by them in the aforesaid letter boxes to the Returning Officer concerned of the Parliamentary Constituency so as to reach the same before the date and hours fixed for counting of votes.
- 7.10 *In addition to the above instructions, the Migrant electors residing at various places other than Jammu, Udhampur and Delhi can also download Form 'M' and Form 12-C from the ECI website and after filling such Forms can be got verified from the Electoral Registration Officer of the areas where he/she is residing. The Electoral Registration Officers can have access to the details of migrant electors enrolled in different Parliamentary Constituency (assembly segment-wise) in Kashmir through ERO-Net. The ERO concerned, after verifying details in the Form 'M' will scan and upload to electronically transmit the same to AROs Migrants at Delhi, Jammu and Udhampur for further necessary action. Hard copy so uploaded, are to be sent to AROs Migrant Delhi, Jammu and Udhampur as the case may be.*
- 7.11 *Similarly, the ERO concerned will verify the details in Form 12-C and sign the certificate in Part-II of the Form and scan and upload it to electronically transmit the same to the ARO Migrant at Jammu who will take further necessary action to send Postal Ballot to the elector concerned. Hard copies so uploaded are to be sent to ARO Migrant at Jammu.*
- 7.12 *The Postal Ballot will be sent through Speed post to the elector concerned by the ARO Migrant, Jammu. The elector can send polled Postal Ballot through Speed post (free of cost) to the Returning Officer concerned of the Parliamentary constituency to which he belong so that the same can reach the RO concerned in time. The cost of Speed Post will be paid by the R.O. concerned.*

Counting of Votes:

- 8.1 As has been stated in para 2.3 above, the counting of the votes cast at the special polling stations should be done by the specified AROs and the result transmitted by them to the ROs concerned by using Form 20. Such transmission of the result by the AROs may be done by using fax, e-mail or any other means of fast communication available, followed by a duly authenticated copy.
- 8.2 The Returning Officer only of the Parliamentary Constituency concerned shall count postal ballot papers.

2. Those who wish to exercise their franchise in person should intimate details of the electors in their families to the Assistant Returning Officers mentioned below in prescribed Form 'M', which is available free of cost at the office of these Assistant Returning Officers, so as to reach them at least ten days before the date of poll. Option once given shall be final.

5. All migrant voters other than those who opted to vote in person have the option to vote through postal ballot papers. They may apply for the postal ballot paper in the prescribed form 12C available in the offices of the Assistant Returning Officers mentioned above.

6. They are advised to send the application forms (Form 12 C) duly filled in, requesting for the Postal Ballot to the concerned Assistant Returning Officer at Jammu (mentioned in para 4 above) so as to reach him 10 days before the date of poll for each phase. To facilitate attestation of forms, sufficient number of gazetted officers will be available at these centres and will attest the same.

7. They can also drop their application forms, and later on, their marked postal ballot papers in the special letterboxes, which will also be available at offices of all the Assistant Returning Officers mentioned above.

8. In addition to the above instructions, the Migrant electors residing at various places other than Jammu, Udhampur and Delhi can also download Form 'M' and Form 12-C from the ECI website and after filling such Forms can be got verified from the Electoral Registration Officer of the areas where he/she is residing. The Electoral Registration Officers can have access to the details of migrant electors enrolled in different Parliamentary Constituency (assembly segment-wise) in Kashmir through ERO-Net. The ERO concerned, after verifying details in the Form 'M' will scan and upload to electronically transmit the same to AROs Migrants at Delhi, Jammu and Udhampur for further necessary action. NOW, THEREFORE, the Election Commission of India, in exercise of powers conferred by Section 60 (c) of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, for the purposes of giving votes at the poll in the General Election to the House of the People, to be held in the year 2019, in pursuance of the notifications to be issued by the President under Section 14 of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, hereby notifies after consultation with the Central Government, the aforesaid migrant electors enrolled in any of the Parliamentary Constituencies of 1-Baramulla, 2-Srinagar and 3-Anantnag, who are residing outside their place of residence, but other than those who have been notified under section 25 of the said Act to vote in person, as the class of persons to give their votes by postal ballot, subject to the fulfillment of the requirements specified in the rules made under the said Act.
